Finger Play

1st phrase: Make a ball with both hands, touching index fingers and thumbs.

2nd phrase: Make a hammer with left hand palm out flat, and right hand in a fist, tapping the left hand.

3rd phrase: Make a trumpet with both hands in fists, placing them behind each other at the mouth, and move them back and forth for the 'Toots.'

4th phrase: Cover your eyes with your hands. On the word 'booo!' remove them from your face.
